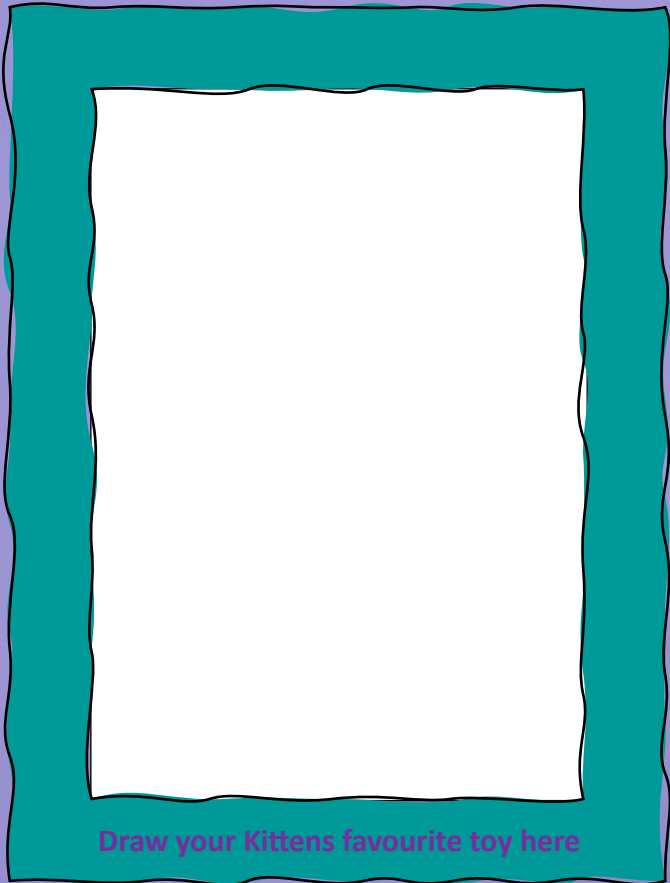

A really good way to understand your kitten is to think of your friends. Some of your friends may like playing sports, while others may prefer to paint pictures.

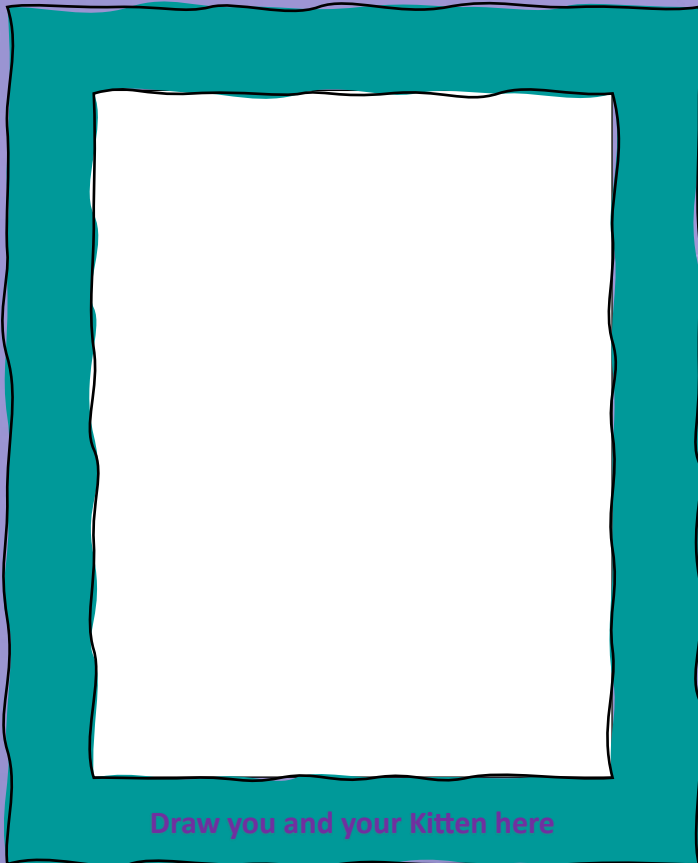
Kittens are the same, they don't play sport or paint pictures, but some kittens may like sleeping all the time and some may like climbing trees. Every kitten is different!

Remember, if it important to be kind to our pets.

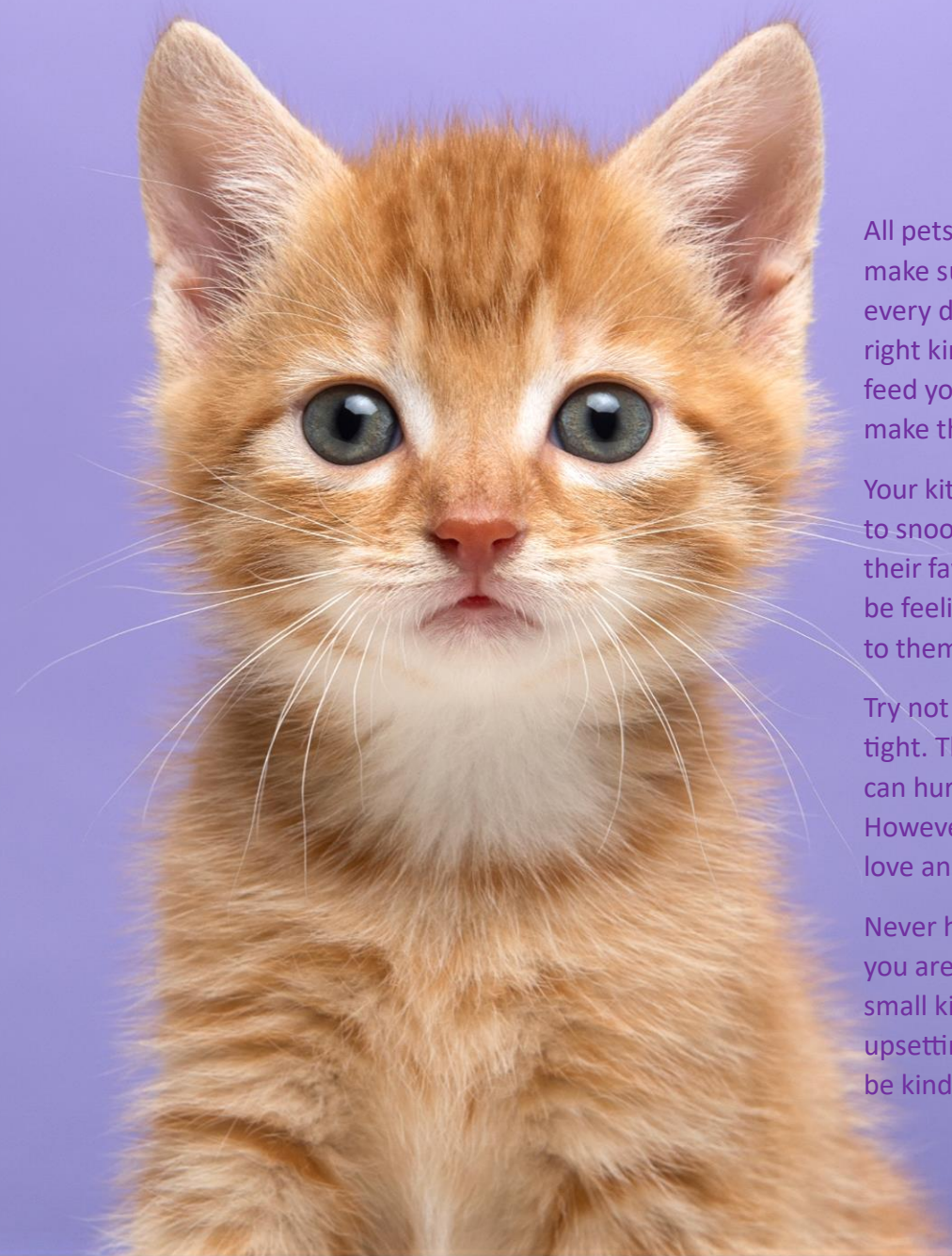
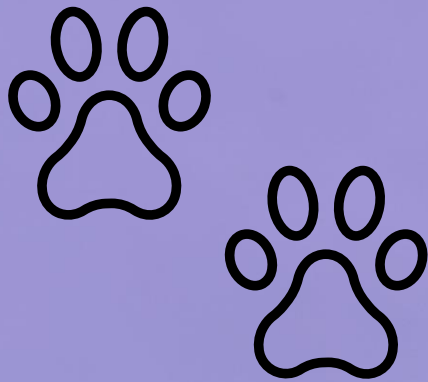
